To learn the basic history, theories, and practices of international cooperation.

To evaluate and analyze the performance of international organizations in international cooperation.

#### 授業の内容 (Course Contents)

To deepen the understanding of international cooperation's history, theories, and functions. To be familiar with diverse empirical cases through research.

To visit agencies that engage in international cooperation in the fields of security and economic development. All the communication throughout the course is in English.

#### 授業計画 (Course Schedule)

1. Part 1: Japan and the UN Peacekeeping Operations (Aug. 6-Aug. 8)
2. Pre-Lecture1: History and functions of international organizations
3. Pre-Lecture2: Japan's international cooperation through the United Nations
4. Pre-Lecture3: the history and practice of Japan's participation in UN peacekeeping operations
5. Pre-Lecture4: the peace constitution of Japan
6. Field Trip (Visit the Secretariat of the International Peace Cooperation Headquarters, Cabinet Office and/or the Defense Academy) To receive lecture and discuss Japan's role in UN peacekeeping operations. Special attention is paid to the possibilities and limitations of Japan's more proactive role in UN peace enforcement operations.
7. Follow-up Session : Class Presentation, Class Discussion, Final report (Class discussion, class presentation, and final report about each student's thought about the challenges and perspectives of Japan's role in UN PKO) Final report should be between 1,200-1,500 words. Final report is to be submitted within one week after the follow-up session.
8. Part 2: International Cooperation for Economic and Social Development of Developing Countries: the roles of international organizations and global civil society (Sep. 3-Sep. 5)
9. Pre-Lecture1 (Understand the basic theories of international development and the historical challenges. The role of international organizations, states, and multilateral corporations in international cooperation for developing countries' economic development.)
10. Pre-Lecture2 (Understand the basic theories of international development and the historical challenges. The role of international organizations, states, and multilateral corporations in international cooperation for developing countries' economic development.)
11. Field Trip (Visit development-related organizations. Maybe OECD Tokyo Center, JETRO. To receive lecture and have discussions about the practice of international cooperation in economic development)
12. Follow-up Learning, Class Presentation, Final report (Class discussion, class

presentation, and final report about each student`s idea about Japan`s international cooperation for development through the United Nations) Final report should be between 1,200-1,500 words. Final report is to be submitted within one week after the follow-up session.
